### Disposing of Snow

The Municipal Council would like to remind the population that according to By-Law #19-06, Article 9, it is prohibited to:

- a) Dispose of snow from your yard into the street;
  - b) Transport, from one side of the street to the other, any snow from ones' property.
- Anyone who contravenes this By-Law could receive a fine from the Sûreté du Québec.

### By-Law #22-08

#### Article 1

The property tax rate is set at \$.55/\$100.00 for the year 2023 to comply with the evaluation roll that comes into effect on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

#### Article 2

The tax rate for garbage is set at:

Household with occupancy of 6 months or more per year	165.00\$
Local Businesses	190.00\$
Per household with occupancy of less than 6 months per Year.	100.00\$

#### Article 3

The recycling tax is set at:

Household with occupancy of 6 months or more per year	60.00\$
Local Businesses	65.00\$
Per household with occupancy of less than 6 month per Year.	40.00\$

#### Article 4

The interest rate on all taxes not paid to the Municipality within the delays specified is set at 12% and is charged at the variable method, starting on January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.

#### Article 5

The present By-Law will enter into effect according to the law. The present By-Law was adopted on December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2022.

### Public Notice
