<u>Municipal Regulation Regarding Wood Cutting in Private</u> Forests

The MRC de Bonaventure wishes to advise its population that regulations regarding the cutting of trees in private forest is in force throughout its territory.

Since 2002, regulations governing the cutting of trees in private forests were adopted to protect our natural resources. Wood is the key factor in

these regulations, considering that it is an important resource in terms of sales income and the

transformation of cut wood. Sight must not be lost of the fact that the forest is the primary site for recreational and tourist projects. Each of the 13 municipalities within our jurisdiction has included these

regulations, which were enacted in 2002, into their own urbanism and local zoning regulations. The MRC ensures the enforcement of these regulations for all the municipalities, as well as within the organized territory (UT).

An authorized certificate is required when you perform work which is not permitted within the legal framework of the regulations in force, as for example, if you:

- Cut wood in an area of more than 10 acres in a contiguous area.
- A forest clearing with an overall area harvested over a period of 5 years or less, of more than 30% of the total wooded arear of the property; A derogation from the regulations may be allowed for several reasons. For example, If you:
- Clear the forest in an area affected by an epidemic of insects or sickness or to prevent the spread of insects or sicknesses;
- Clear the forest in an area in which there is more than 40% of commercial wood and/or 25% of the standing volume that has been flattened by a windfall;
- Work regarding conversion cutting, recovery cutting, regeneration cutting or succession cutting. In the case of conversion cutting, the operation must be followed by land preparation and reforestation within a period of five years:
- period of five years;
 Clear forest in an area in which the growth is mature. However, the cutting methods used must ensure the protection of the regenerated trees. For the issue of an authorization certificate, an application for a derogation must first be filed with the MRC using the form provided for that purpose. The required supporting documentation involving the harvesting work, such as a development plan or a valid and compliant sylviculture prescription, as defined under the regulations, must be enclosed. These documents must be signed by a forestry engineer.

After receiving an application for a derogation, the person in charge at the MRC conducts an analysis within a maximum time limit of 30 business days and as the case may be, issues an authorization certificate to the applicant.

It is therefore essential before undertaking to harvest wood on a large scale on your property or authorizing a forestry contractor to do so, to check all related regulations. When a forestry contractor offers you his services to harvest wood on your property, you must have the reflex to seek out the information necessary to ensure that the wood harvest work is performed in compliance with the regulations in force.

It is important not to lose sight of the fact that you are always responsible for the work performed and for compliance with the regulations on your property. In case a contractor performs the work, he becomes responsible and subject to the regulations just like an owner. At that point, you both become jointly responsible.
